The purpose of this meeting is for Council to review and potentially vote on the separation and employment terms of the Incumbent Borough Manager and a Borough Manager candidate, and other general business.

Pledge of Allegiance:

Council President Joseph LeDonne opened the Council Meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call:

Council Members present and responding to roll call were: Tammy Kemp, Scott Brumbaugh, Joseph LeDonne, Steven Goffredo (via phone), John Apgar, Josephine Hildabrant, Stephanie Cooper and Joann Anderson.

Mayor Stephen Male and Solicitor Peter Layman were also present.

Visitors:

Adrienne Fors and Joe Rohrman from WM provided an update of the residential collection plan, with the next trash and recycle collection scheduled for Saturday January 3, 2026 due to the holidays and snow storm delay.

Executive Session:

Council went into Executive Session at 6:47 p.m. to discuss Personnel matters on a motion by Councilwoman Tammy Kemp, seconded by Councilman Scott Brumbaugh. Unanimous by roll call. Council resumed Open Session at 7:30 p.m.

Personnel:

Councilwoman Tammy Kemp made a motion for Solicitor Layman to draft a response to Attorney John Harrison (Borough Manager's attorney) regarding the separation agreement, seconded by Councilman Scott Brumbaugh. Unanimous by roll call.

Councilwoman Tammy Kemp made a motion for Solicitor Layman to draft a response to Manager candidate Brian Fenstermaker's letter regarding employment terms, seconded by Councilman Steven Goffredo. Voting yes were Councilpersons Kemp, Brumbaugh, LeDonne, Goffredo, Apgar, Hildabrant and Anderson. Councilwoman Stephanie Cooper abstained. There being 7 yes votes and 1 abstain, the motion passed.


New Business:
