Regulations for Outdoor Fires in Pen Argyl Borough

No person shall kindle or maintain any bonfire or rubbish fire or authorize any such fire to be kindled or maintained on any private land unless:

- The location is not less than 50 feet from any structure and adequate provision is made to prevent fire from spreading to within 50 feet of any structure.
- The fire is contained in an approved burner located safely not less than 15 feet from any structure.
- The fire is constantly attended by a competent person until such fire is extinguished. This person should have a garden hose connected to a water supply, or fire extinguishing equipment is readily available for use.
- The Lookout Fire Chief is permitted to prohibit any or all fires when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazards.

In conclusion have fun, be safe, and be courteous of your neighbors. Enjoying a recreational fire is a privilege not a right.







Pen Argyl Public Work's Fall Leaf Schedule

Leaf pickup will begin on 10/30 and continue to 11/17. No pickup during holiday light installation 11/20-11/22 (if installation completed ahead of schedule pickup will resume earlier), pickup resumes 11/27, last day of collection is scheduled for 12/8. Please refrain from placing leaves in roadway if inclement weather is predicted. Please do not place piles close to parked vehicles. The crew cannot pick up piles if they contain sticks, stones, or animal feces, it is a health hazard.




The following is the general snow and ice removal policy for the Borough with suggestions for the residents to help make the job more efficient and effective. This is a general policy, and each storm will dictate how it is implemented and what adjustments will be made. At the start of each storm all the trucks are loaded with salt and sent out to its assigned areas to salt. Salt needs the movement of traffic to make it most effective; so, if it seems your street has not been salted it may just be that there has not been enough traffic on it yet. For the initial plowing sequence, the drivers are instructed to make one pass in each direction on the street and one pass in and one out in cul-de-sacs (up the middle). Pen Argyl Borough has 12 miles of roads (4 miles of state roads) and two cul-de-sacs. Our first objective is to make each road passable. After that has been achieved we will commence pushing back of the roads where feasible. This may not be started until the following day because the employees will be sent home to rest after spending long grueling hours working in the initial plowing effort.

Suggestions for the residents to help make the snow removal effort more effective and efficient are as follows:

VEHICLE PARKING: If possible, park off the roadway in your driveway. In the case of those homes with steep driveways, just park in the mouth of the driveway off the roadway. Cul-de-sacs are especially difficult to plow with vehicles on the roadway.

SHOVELING SIDEWALKS: If you only want to shovel one time wait until the street is plowed back to the curb and plowing is done. When shoveling, throw the snow into your yard not the curb or outside edge of sidewalk. You risk a fine for throwing snow in roadway.

SNOW EMERGENCY ROADWAYS: If a snow emergency is called no parking is allowed on the following snow emergency routes: RT 512, E & W Main and E Streets;



W. Laurel and N. & S. Robinson Avenues. Snow Emergencies will be posted on WFMZ, Facebook, Webpage, Newsletter email blast and NIXLE (sign up at: https://local.nixle.com/register/).

PEN ARGYL BOROUGH: WASTE & RECYCLING



WHAT SIZE CONTAINERS SHOULD I USE?

Household waste containers should be 32-gallon containers and may not exceed 50 pounds in weight when loaded. Please use only sturdy plastic or metal containers with handles and detachable lid. There is a 5-container limit.

Do not use cardboard boxes for trash containers. They can become damp and fall apart at the curb.

Recyclables should be placed in a recycle bin or a container clearly marked as "Recycling".

Do not tie your recycling with string of any kind and please keep plastic bags out of the curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags and string (or tanglers) jam our recycling equipment.

WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED?

Paper: newspaper, magazines, catalogs, cereal boxes, flattened cardboard. This must be dry and free of any food waste. Nothing smaller than 2-inches

Glass: bottles and jars

Metal: food and beverage cans

Plastics: any household plastic containers with #1-#7 stamped on the bottom.

(Except clam shell containers and k-cups. These are not recyclable)

Unacceptable Trash items

Household hazardous wastes such as: gasoline, waste oil, paints, pesticides, drain cleaners, pool chemicals, bottle gas, car or truck parts are **NOT PERMITTED** with regular household waste.

Liquid wastes of any type will NOT be accepted for collection. All paint containers must be completely dry and lids removed.

Construction project items such as a remodel or basement/attic cleanouts are not permitted with this free service. Please call 1-800-621-2100 to rent a dumpster.

Large items (furniture, cabinets, washers, dryers, etc.) are collected once a week.

There is a limit of one bulk item per week.

Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers containing CFC's will be collected the first Saturday in May and in November with an appointment only. Items must have the CFC's removed prior by an approved certified technician. Make an appointment via 1.888.373.2917 two weeks prior to the collection event.

Carpet must be cut into 4-foot lengths, tied and bundled.

Mattresses/box springs must be wrapped in plastic.

Holiday Schedules

If your trash and recycling collection day falls on a holiday, it will be picked up on the next scheduled collection day. Grand Central Hauling and Landfill are closed on:

New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Day

Single Stream Recycling Collection

All recyclables may be placed in the same recycling container and put out for collection every other Friday. Please do not include plastic bags of any kind with your recycling.

What Pen Argyl Borough Can Recycle

These items may be placed in the container for single-stream recycling

- Plastics: 1.2.3.4.5.6.7
- Glass: bottles and jars
- Metal: bi-metal, aluminum or tin cans
- Paper: newsprint, small cardboard boxes (shoe, gift, cereal boxes), magazines, phone books, envelopes, junk mail
- Cartons: Milk, cream, wine, juice, broth, egg substitutes
- Corrugated cardboard: please cut or flatten boxes

These items are not accepted for recycling

- Plastics: any plastic that is not marked with 1 to 7 in recycling symbol, toys, garden hoses, pool covers, bowling balls, clam-shell containers (think tomato and fruit containers)
- Glass: mirrors, plate glass, drinking glasses, glass cookware
- Electronics: TV's, microwave ovens, appliances
- Styrofoam, propane tanks, tires
- Any soiled or greasy paper or cardboard, including pizza boxes
- Used Syringes please use our Think Green from Home program for this

Waste Management will not collect yard waste, grass, televisions, computer equipment, appliances containing refrigerants, construction debris and hazardous waste. Our company also will not collect any liquid waste, including paint. If you have paint you no longer need, attempt to give it to someone who can use it. Otherwise, before placing out for the trash collection allow the paint to dry out or add cat litter or sand to the paint so that is no longer liquid.

Recycling Options

Recycle automotive batteries and used motor oil through a service station or car parts supplier. Recycle dry-cell batteries, CFL light bulbs, electronics and safely dispose of used syringes using Waste Management's for-a-fee, order-from-home services available through www.thinkgreenfromhome.com Also visit www.wm.com/recycleright website to learn more about recycling.

- 1. Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways, sidewalks, and gutters.
- 2. Never dump anything down storm drains or in streams.
- 3. Vegetate bare spots in your yard.
- 4. Compost your yard waste.
- Use least toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems.
- 6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture run-off.
- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- 8. Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil.
- 9. Pick-up after your pet
- 10. Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly.
